Statement on conflict minerals

In recent years, there has been an increased awareness of an extremely violent conflict in the Democratic Republic of Kongo (“DRC”) and surrounding countries (together with the DRC, the so-called “covered countries”), which has been partially financed by the exploitation and trade of cassiterite, columbite-tantalite, gold, wolframite and three specified derivatives – tin, tantalum and tungsten (“conflict minerals”), by armed groups in the covered countries.

With the adoption of the **U.S. Congress bill H.R. 4173 (Dodd-Frank act), specifically with regard to section 1502 about conflict minerals**, the origin of so-called conflict minerals is concerned with serious issues and concerns within the supply chain of the relevant raw materials.

Angland Electronics is committed to the ethical sourcing of minerals used in the articles we produce. We assess whether the articles contain conflict minerals from the covered countries. However, the global supply chain for these minerals is complex, and tracing the minerals to their source is a challenge. Angland Electronics is working diligently with our suppliers and other stakeholders to improve and systematically address the process for sourcing minerals that are conflict free.
